





**Samantha Campbell** is a children's book illustrator and graphic designer. She is descended from the Dagoman people and lives in Mparntwe (Alice Springs) with her family. She draws inspiration from her childhood growing up in remote Aboriginal communities across the Top End. Her first picture book, *Alfred's War* (written by Rachel bin Salleh), was short-listed for the Premier's Literary Awards and the Speech Pathology Awards. Since then, she has illustrated numerous picture books including *Aunty's Wedding, Freedom Day*, and *My Deadly Boots*.







#### THE MOST AMAZING THING Ian Hayward Robinson, illustrated by Matt Shanks




A remarkable picture book about wonder and hope that explores the meaning of life in ways that we can all understand.

#### HOW TO MOVE A ZOO Kate Simpson, illustrated by Owen Swan



The true story of how at the beginning of the 20th century Jessie the elephant walked from Sydney's Moore Park Zoo to her spacious new home in the Taronga Zoological Park.

It was still dark when Mr Miller opened the gates of the old zoo, but he wasn't scared because he wasn't alone. He was with Jessie the elephant and together they were going to walk through the city streets to the ferry at Fort Macquarie and on to Jessie's spacious new home.


Jessie's surprising journey was unlike any other and it brought a little warmth to the city on that brisk September morning in 1916.

**Kate Simpson** was raised on a diet of children's books, but it was her fascination with science that led her to her first career as a chemical engineer. Following the birth of her children, Kate re-discovered her love of picture books and soon decided to try her hand at writing them. Kate now juggles a full-time job as an engineer with her writing work. Her books feature Australian history, science, curious kids and powerful women. **Owen Swan** is an award-winning Australian illustrator whose work includes *Out by Angela May George* (Picture Book of The Year CBCA Shortlist & winner of the AAFT Book Award for Children's Literature), *My Friend Tertius* by Corinne Fenton (a CBCA Notable); the bestselling picture book *Anzac Biscuits*, along with *Newspaper Hats* by Phil Cummings (winner of the Chronos Prize for Literature in France).





#### TREE Claire Saxby, illustrated by Jess Racklyeft



A journey of wonder and discovery that explores life in and around a mighty tree from the bottom of its roots up to the tips of its upper branches.

Can you see the forest on this misty-morning mountain? Can you see where the tree stands? It is the tallest in this forest of tall trees. 



#### WALKING THE ROCK COUNTRY IN KAKADU Diane Lucas and Ben Tyler, illustrated by Emma Long



Walk with us through stunning rock country in Australia's iconic Kakadu National Park, learning about the plants, animals and Kundjeyhmi culture along the way.

Diane Lucas, Ben Tyler and Emma Long – the team behind the CBCA-shortlisted *Walking in Gagudju Country* – share stories, knowledge and their love of one of Australia's most ancient and beautiful ecosystems. Emma's beautifully rendered images bring to life its rich and varied plant and animal life, encouraging readers to see, hear, smell and feel the land and experience how Aboriginal people have lived and walked Country for thousands of years.



**Diane Lucas** grew up exploring the bush in New South Wales. She moved to Kakadu in her twenties, worked as a schoolteacher on an Aboriginal outstation and in turn was taught many things about the bush. She was encouraged by the elders to write about the land and get stories to children. They have supported her efforts as an educator with her children's books, the first being *Walking with the Seasons in Kakadu*. Since then she has had seven others. **Ben Tyler** is a Bininj entrepreneur and founder of bush food brand

Kakadu Kitchen. He lives in Darwin on Larrakia country and returns home to visit his family at their remote outstation at Patonga Homestead, located beside the Jim Jim Creek in Kakadu National Park. The community includes close relatives from Tiwi Islands and welcomes family, friends and visitors into their busy, noisy, joyful billabong home. **Emma Long** lives in Darwin, works as an illustrator and an art educator, and exhibits regularly across the Northern Territory. They are inspired by the fresh, raw beauty of nature and feel most at home in the bush with a brush in hand.



An historical yet timeless story about pursuing dreams and pushing boundaries.





# THE REAL FACTS ABOUT ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE


Let Dr Matt explain everything you and your kids need to know about Artificial Intelligence and why you don't need to be afraid!

When you think of AI, you might imagine a walking, talking robot or you might think of a giant computer that wants to take over the world, but the reality is that AI is a brilliant human invention that can be found in nearly every modern device from our computers to our cars.

With no internet or phone coverage, Ruth spends her time re-reading old Agatha Christie novels, eavesdropping on the adults and definitely not daydreaming about Dylan.

But when GG dies under suspicious circumstances, Ruth's long weekend turns into an enforced family-holiday-slash-possible-murder-investigation – and Ruth's not about to let the police get in the way of her chance to solve a real-life murder mystery. With Dylan as the Watson to her Holmes, Ruth soon discovers that plenty of people had reasons to be rid of GG, and her list of suspects grows to comprise everyone in the house including, in the interests of fairness, herself.

As Ruth says, the thing about family holidays is that you've got to be prepared for fights.

Well-crafted, suspenseful, playful and clean, *My Family and Other Suspects* is also very funny and includes a chaste yet satisfying romance.

#### I'M NOT REALLY HERE Gary Lonesborough




