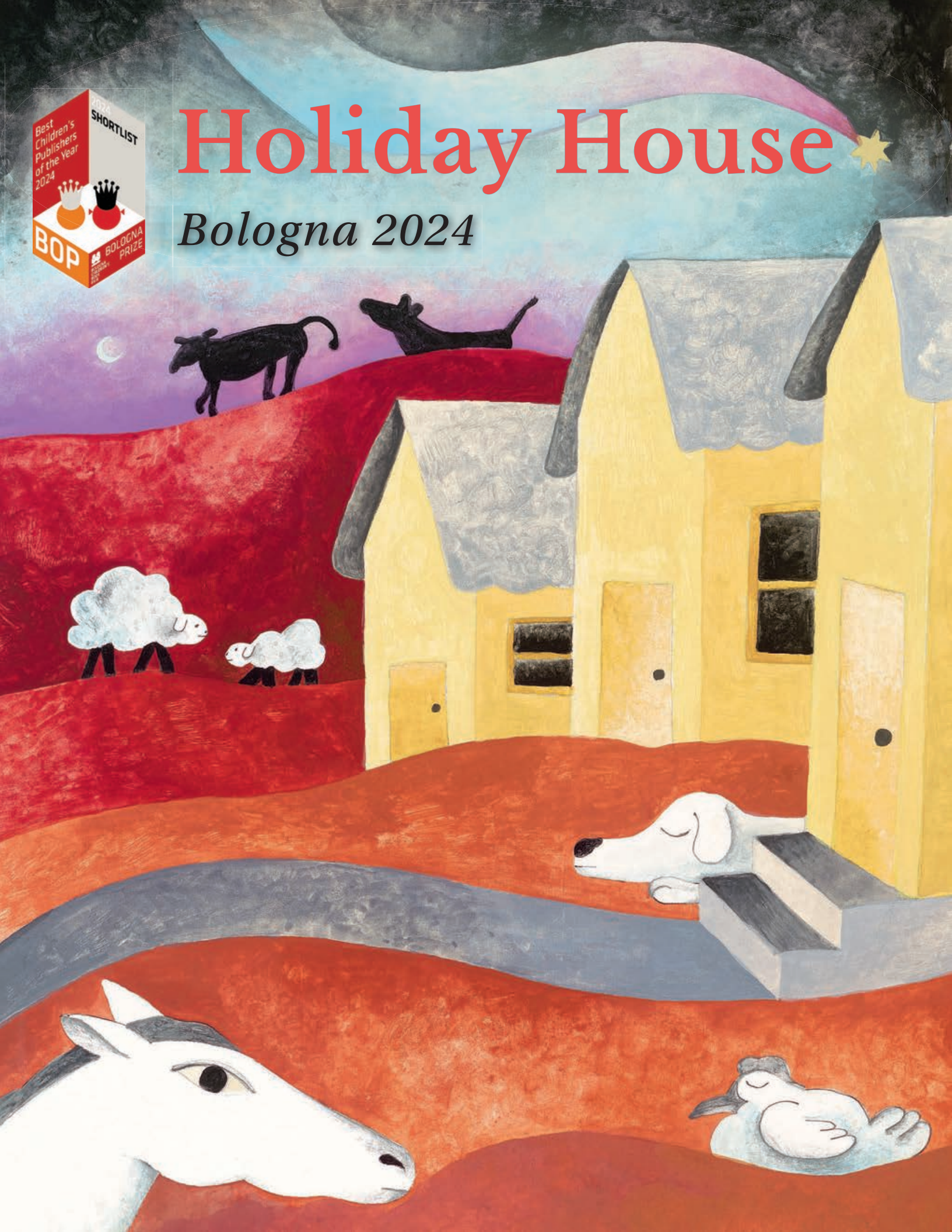

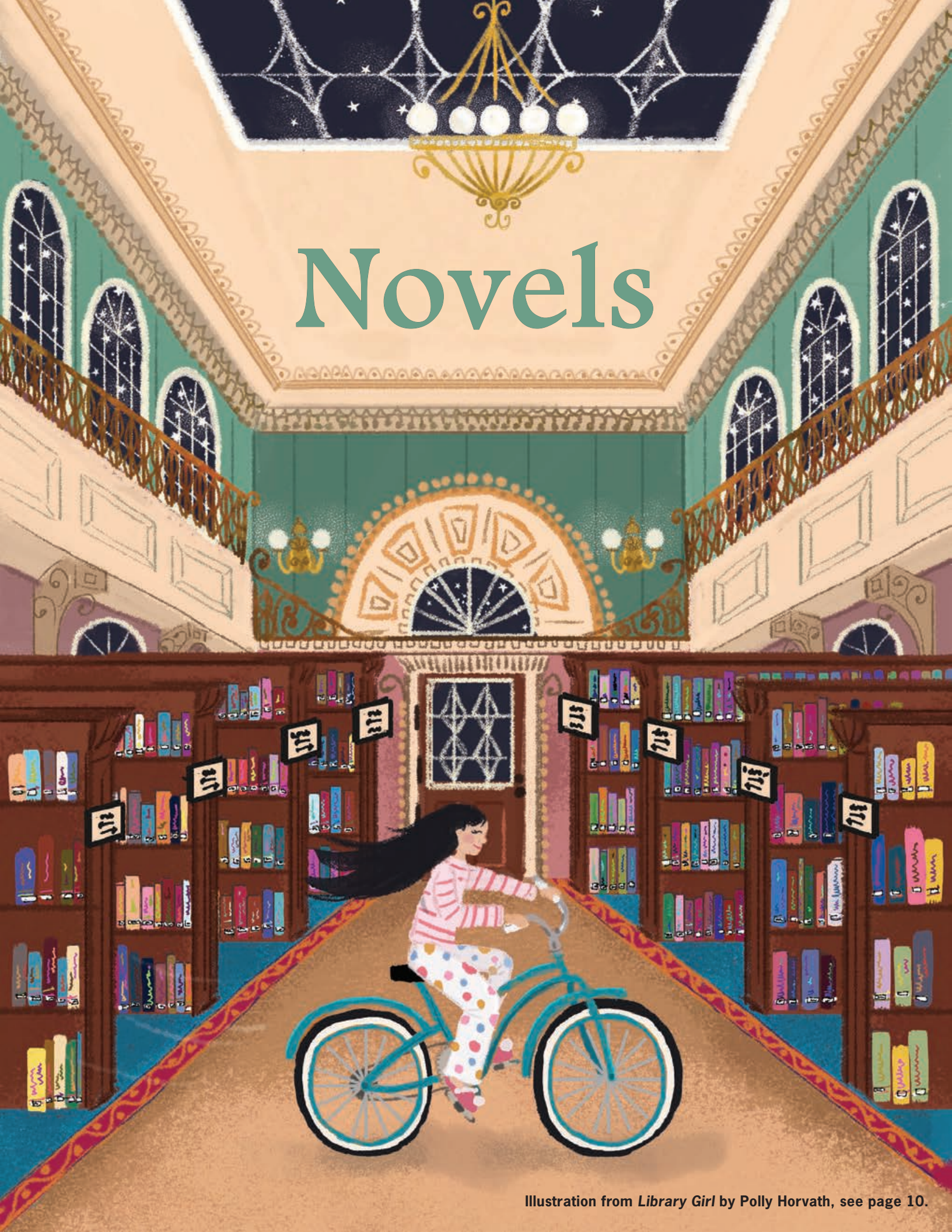

A SECOND CHANCE ON EARTH

A father, a friend, and a favorite book help a teen boy understand love and loss in this novel-in-verse.

After sixteen-year-old Marcos' father is killed in a motorcycle accident, he travels to his parents' home of Colombia to spread Papi's ashes. He brings with him a beat-up copy of *One Hundred Years of Solitude* by Gabriel García Márquez—a book he found among his late father's possessions. He believes it holds the key to understanding Papi's life and accepting his death. In Colombia, Marcos doesn't feel at home among his unfamiliar family. Instead, he befriends a taxi driver named Camilo. But when he learns about Camilo's former life as a gang member, Marcos must ask himself whether everyone deserves a second chance. Woven with themes of friendship, family, and forgiveness, this poignant coming-of-age novel is also a love letter to Colombia and to the books of Gabriel García Márquez.

Determined to learn about her roots, Mina secretly travels to the crumbling manor in Alexandria where her mother grew up. But when Mina returns, she doesn't come back alone.

A demonic entity follows her, intent on seeing her dead and capable of turning everyone she knows violently against her. Isolated and fighting for her life, Mina must seek help from an unlikely ally: Jesse Talbot, resident bad boy and the only person who proves immune to being possessed. Jesse would rather floss with barbed wire than team up with social butterfly Mina, but he doesn't exactly have a choice—after all, he's running from family secrets of his own.
