Iris lives on the run with her mother, Rohan. They're travelling to escape the earthquakes, though that's impossible. And they're being followed. One day, Rohan insists Iris repeat the phrase in bocca al lupo: into the mouth of the wolf. The next day, Rohan's vanished, leaving only a contact in an unknown town. Fearing the worst, Iris reaches out to the stranger.

When Lena gets Iris's message, she's busy panic-studying for year 12 and helping run her family's hostel. She's intrigued by Iris, and can't deny the spark between them—but she's also worried. A dead body just washed up in Glassy Bay. And Lena's old best friend—who's just returned after an unexplained absence—knows something about it. Missing people. Mysterious deaths. A growing attraction between two girls caught up in the search for truth. In order to find out how they're all connected, Iris and Lena will have to go into the mouth of the wolf.

With shades of *We Were Liars* and *Station Eleven*, this extraordinary new YA novel explores love and grief in an uncertain climate from one of Australia's most talented writers.

Erin Gough is a Sydney-based writer whose award-winning novels for young adults have been published internationally. Yellowjackets meets Girl, Interrupted when a group of troubled teens in a wilderness therapy program find themselves stranded in a forest full of monsters eager to take their place.

Devin Green wakes in the night to find two men in her bedroom. She calls to her foster parents for help, but it soon becomes clear this is a planned abduction—one everyone but Devin signed up for. She's shoved in a van and driven into the Idaho woods, where she's dropped off with a cohort of confused teens. Two camp counselors inform them they've all been enrolled in an experimental therapy program. If the campers learn to change their self-destructive ways—and survive a fifty-days hike through the wilderness—they'll come out the other side as better versions of themselves. Or so the counselors say.

Devin is determined to escape. She's also determined to ignore Sheridan, the cruel-mouthed bully who mocks every group exercise. But there's something strange about these woods—inhuman faces appearing between the trees, people who shouldn't be there flashing in the leaves—and when the campers wake up to find both counselors missing, therapy becomes the least of their problems. The stranded teens realize they'll have to trust each other if they want to survive. But what lies in the woods may not be as dangerous as what the campers are hid-ing from each other—and if the monsters have their way, no one will leave the woods alive.

Atmospheric and sharp, *What the Woods Took* is a poignant story of transformation that explores the price of becoming someone—or something—new.

Courtney Gould writes books about queer girls, ghosts, and things that go bump in the night. She graduated from Pacific Lutheran University in 2016 with a Bachelor's degree in Creative Writing and Publishing. She was born and raised in Salem, OR, where she continues to write love letters to the haunted girls and rural, empty spaces. She is the author of *The Dead and the Dark* and *Where Echoes Die*.


Alana and Gray have been the perfect couple ever since they got together before high school — and neither of them think that should have to change just because Alana came out as a lesbian.

Sure, things are a little different now: their romantic relationship is over, but their best-friendssince-forever relationship is stronger than ever. And yeah, Alana sees the way her other friends now exclude her in tiny, almost unnoticeable ways, but she still has Gray, and that's all that's ever mattered to her. Really, the only difference is that instead of kissing Gray herself, Alana sets him up with other girls to do that. But when new girl Tal arrives, she stops Alana and Gray in their tracks.

Suddenly, Gray's all-in on his plan to get Tal to fall in love with him, and, for the first time, Alana's reluctant to help. As Alana and Tal grow closer, and Alana begins to think Tal might share her feelings, she has to decide whether to embrace her queerness and risk losing the life she thought she was building, or continue to hide parts of herself and maintain the status quo. *Don't Let it Break Your Heart* is a tender and romantic exploration of identity, love, and friend-ship that turns the friends to lovers romance trope on its head.

Maggie Horne is a writer and editor who grew up near Toronto, Canada. After living in the UK for three years, she imported her best-ever souvenir in the form of her wife, and now lives outside of Ottawa with her family. The author of middle grade novels *Hazel Hill is Gonna Win This One* and *Noah Frye Gets Crushed*, and the upcoming YA novel *Freddie and Stella Got Hot* (Winter 2025), she's always trying to write the queer stories she wish she could have read growing up.

Margot is on the quest to uncover and reassemble an ancient—and cursed—vase, with the help of a boy who went missing in 1932, because it's the only way to put back together her broken heart in this stand-alone adventure rom-com, perfect for fans of What the River *Knows* and *The Lost City*.

The mythical Vase of Venus Aurelia hasn't been seen since 1932, but Margot Rhodes is determined to change that. Drawn by the vase's supposed magical properties, Margot embarks on her school's archaeological trip to Pompeii. Sure, it's her first time holding a shovel, but she's got something no one else does: lost teenage explorer Van Keane's journal.

Poring over the poetic entries that serve as a map to the vase's missing shards, Margot finds herself falling in love with the boy who wrote it a century ago. She's shocked when her search leads her to a statue that looks exactly like Van, and then the statue comes to life.

Catapulted into the present, Van is nothing like the wordsmith Margot imagined. He's all sharp edges, intent on retrieving the relic for all the wrong reasons. But it takes two to survive Venus's death-defying challenges, and, together, Margot and Van must excavate the treasure—and their buried pasts—before their story ends in ruins.

With a blend of humor, magic, and love, Rachel Moore crafts another stand-alone adventure rom-com full of double- and triple-crosses, hilarious shenanigans, and frustration-fueled banter, where the best treasure is true love.

In *The Branded:* Isfalk is divided into two classes: the Branded, who are vulnerable to disease, and the Pure, who are bigger, stronger and immune. Orphaned twins Nara and Osha are sequestered in the citadel, where their unbranded skin entitles them to a life of privilege, as precious breeding stock. Nara itches to escape her confines and return to the wilds of the Fornwood where she and her sister grew up, but when she is forced to run, she discovers there's much more at stake than her own life. Forced to accept the help of a mysterious southern Brand known only as the Wrangler, Nara discovers the latent power lying dormant in uncanny abilities she's had since childhood. But in a world where women are traded as commodities, who can she trust in the lands beyond the Fornwood? Two sisters without a past hold the weight of the future in their hands.

In *The Rising:* Nara and her twin sister, Osha, have escaped the Citadel and the brutality of the Wastelands to arrive in the capital of Reis, home of the Wrangler. The Shadow City is rife with political power plays, complicated by rumours of a long-awaited prophecy—the coming of a Pure healer with the ability to cure the Branded. With her healing powers growing ever stronger, all eyes are on Osha. But there are those in Reis who would kill to control her gifts. If she is to protect her sister, Nara must navigate new allies and old enemies in the Shadow City. That's easier said than done when she's caught between her first love and the man who's stolen her heart but broken her trust. Worn down by lies and deception, Nara is forced to question who she truly is and what she can believe. One thing is becoming clear: she and Osha must learn to wield their powers to guard their freedom, but also to fight for what is right. With dark forces taking control across the continent, the Branded must rise to survive.

Jo Riccioni graduated with a Masters in Medieval Literature from Leeds University, where her studies included Icelandic saga and the Arthurian and Robin Hood legends. Her short stories have won awards in the UK and Australia and have been anthologised in *Best Australian Stories*. Jo's first novel, *The Italians at Cleat's Corner Store*, won the International Rubery Award for fiction and was long-listed for the New Angle Prize in the UK.
