But as the girls prepare for one last sleepover of the summer, Sarah continues to feel butterflies growing in her tummy when she hears Eden speaking Cree. Eden knows so much more about the language and their culture than Sarah; could that be what's creating distance between them? As the night goes on, a magical visit from Maskwa reminds the girls that their differences and their culture is what makes their friendship so special.



Avani has come back from the powwow trail with a bunch of new words in Cree. She can talk to my kôhkom and that's not fair. I want to learn more than the animal names I remember. But I guess I haven't really asked about that this summer either . . .

Why can't I live in both places at the same time?

"Ugh, life isn't fair!" I say out loud to no one.

It doesn't sound like Kôhkom is going to hang up anytime soon. I guess I will go and look for Eden and Avani.

When I turn the corner to use the path between our houses, I see something very big in the yard blocking it. I stop and stare, standing in front of a shadow that stretches to the tips of my toes.

"Wow!" I gasp.

It takes up most of the grassy area. It's so tall! At least four of me standing on top of my head, maybe more.

"Kôhkom? What is this . . ." I say under my breath.

I wonder if this is connected to the Eden mystery?

Sita MacMillan continues to explore topsy-turvy feelings of growing up as a young Indigenous person living away from their community, with magical illustrations from Azby Whitecalf that transport the reader into the forest once again with Sarah Ponakey.

SITA MacMILLAN is a registered member of Zagime Anishinabek and is of a mixed Cree and Scottish background. As a mother to three daughters, Sita was struggling to find children's books based on urban Indigenous living. This became the inspiration for her debut children's book series, Sarah Ponakey, Storycatcher. She lives with her family in Prince Edward Island.

AZBY WHITECALF is a Plains Cree illustrator and character designer. Whitecalf is a graduate of AUArts, majoring in illustration with a bachelor's degree in design and is the illustrator of *Buffalo Wild!* They have fondness for fantasy stories, whimsical tales, and vibrant characters. 




Will Lari be able to figure out the secret of the broken planet and face the powerful Cynosure? Can he save not only his brother, but the people of Zephyr too?
