Little Lazarus is the story of two clairvoyant tortoises who bear witness to centuries of human suffering.

Teenagers Francois and Eleanor are lonely and wild in the small Southern town of Harmony that promises them nothing but more of the same: nothing. Scott Carson is the pseudonym of Michael Koryta, a *New York Times* bestselling author whose work has been translated into more than twenty languages, adapted into major motion pictures, and won the *Los Angeles Times* Book Prize. 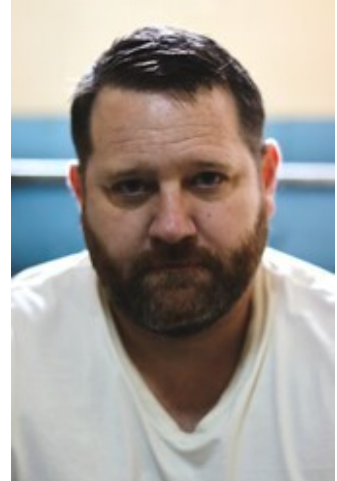

THE MIND REELS



The Mind Reels is a short novel about a young woman named Alice who goes to college, and starts to suffer from mental illness, and then suffers more. It draws from the author's experiences. It will be Fredrik deBoer's first novel.

It is an extraordinarily straightforward novel, but a thrilling one. Like a boulder rolling downhill toward a cabin: even though we see where this is going, it is captivating, and not a little frightening. Many other novels and memoirs have depicted mental illness, and treatment. But so many of them shy away from embracing the brisk reality of what it's really like, and, instead, attend to familiar storytelling devices and proper arrangements of dramatic tension and release. As deBoer might say: mental illness is not exciting. It certainly does not daintily follow the form of a well-told story. Not in the classical sense. But here, in *The Mind Reels*, there is an excitement in being permitted to see something develop that almost always develops out of sight. The experience of reading it gives the feeling of an impossibly intrusive case study. It succeeds by tantalizing the reader with an accumulation of very, very true-seeming experiences, instead of another collection of clichés.

This is a novel that can make a splash, especially with young people. It has a sheerness of reality, and a total attention to true detail. No item of Alice's dorm room, or her first drunken party, or her fraying relationships with her friends and family (who only want to help her) is out of place, or out of touch with the truth. This can be a novel that really spreads, because it really tells the truth, and it really doesn't sound like anything else.

In the foothills of the Himalayas, the picturesque mountain village of Poshkarbal is home to lush cherry and apple orchards and a thriving community — one divided by a patrolled border. Aisha and her mother Noorjahan live on the outskirts — two women alone in a world dominated by men. As the village midwife, Noorjahan teaches Aisha how to heal using herbs and remedies. Isolated but content, Aisha is shocked when Noorjahan decides it is time for her to attend the village school as few girls do. Despite the taunting of her classmates and the teacher’s resistance to having her in the class, Aisha becomes a star student, destined for college.

When Aisha’s hand is bequeathed to a local boy in the village, she is forced to abandon her dreams of college. She comforts herself by staying on her ancestral land, creating a nourishing life with her children and husband. But her mother’s secrets come back to haunt her and her marriage and the growing military presence in Poshkarbal force Aisha to make impossible choices in order to save her family and preserve the independence Noorjahan fought for.

A deeply moving novel about one woman’s love for her family, this is an epic investigation of colonialism, militarization, and the loss and innocence on the journey to creating home. Spanning 1969 to 2022, *Call Her Freedom* is a love story that untangles family secrets and heals generational wounds, announcing Tara Dorabji as a thrilling new voice in fiction.

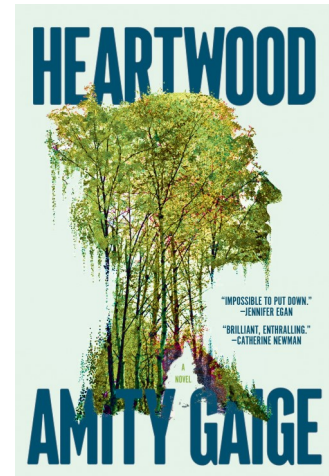

Beloved author Margot Bradley has a dark secret: she doesn't believe in Happily Ever Afters. Not for herself, not for her readers, and not even for her characters, for whom she secretly writes alternate endings that swap weddings and babies for divorce papers and the occasional slashed tire. When her Happily Never After document is hacked and released to the public, she finds herself canceled by her readers and dropped by her publisher.

Desperate to find a way to continue supporting her chronically ill sister Savannah, Margot decides to trade meet-cutes for murder. The fictional kind. But when Savannah books Margot a six-week stay in a remote Alaskan resort to pen her first murder mystery, Margot finds herself running from a moose and leaping into the arms of the handsome proprietor, making her fear she's just landed in a romance novel instead. Meanwhile, the last thing Dr. Forrest Wakefield ever expected was to leave his dream job as a cancer researcher to become a glorified bellhop. But what he's really doing at his family's resort is caring for his stubborn, ailing father—until Margot shows up.

As long snowy nights and one unlikely trope after another draw Margot and Forrest together, they'll each have to learn to overcome their fears and set their assumptions aside before Margot leaves—or risk becoming a Happily Never After story themselves.

Award-winning journalist John Beck recounts China's persecution of Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs and other predominantly Muslim minorities in Xinjiang and its relentless pursuit of the few who escaped beyond its borders. Through intertwined literary narratives combined with snippets of original source material, including official directives and speeches, he pieces together the individual stories of what consecutive American administrations have described as genocide.

The narrative moves from China to Kazakhstan, Turkey and the US, incorporating the tensions, discrimination, and occasional violence that has characterized life in Xinjiang for decades. Then the dismantling of rights and escalating repression under President Xi Jinping that quickly accelerated into a crackdown of unprecedented scope and brutality.

We follow four characters: a Kazakh writer and an Uyghur nurse who survived re-education camps before ultimately escaping abroad, a human rights advocate involved in securing their release and an inadvertent exile spied on by Chinese authorities as his family back home was used as leverage against him.

Through their stories, the book explores identity, dehumanization, and censorship, the force of literature in dark times, and an all-pervasive apparatus of repression able to exist within miles of the White House.

John Beck lived in Istanbul for several years, where he was in close contact with the city's Uyghur diaspora and wrote on the crackdown and related issues for publications including *Harper's* and *National Geographic*. Some of that work forms the basis of this book along with further reporting from Almaty, Kazakhstan, Virginia, and New York.

These tribal instincts enable us to share knowledge and goals and work as a team to transmit the accumulated pool of cultural knowledge onward to the next generation.

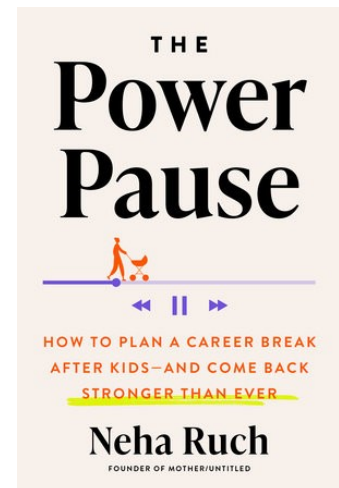
Countries, political parties, and companies are tribes, and tribal instincts explain our loyalties to them and the hidden ways that they affect our thoughts, actions, and identities. Rather than deriding tribal impulses for their irrationality, we can recognize them as powerful levers that elevate performance, heal rifts, and set off shockwaves of cultural change. Weaving together research, current and historical events, and stories from business and politics, Morris cuts across conventional wisdom to reframe how we think about our tribes. *Tribal* unlocks the secrets of our psychology and gives us the tools to manage our misunderstood superpower.
