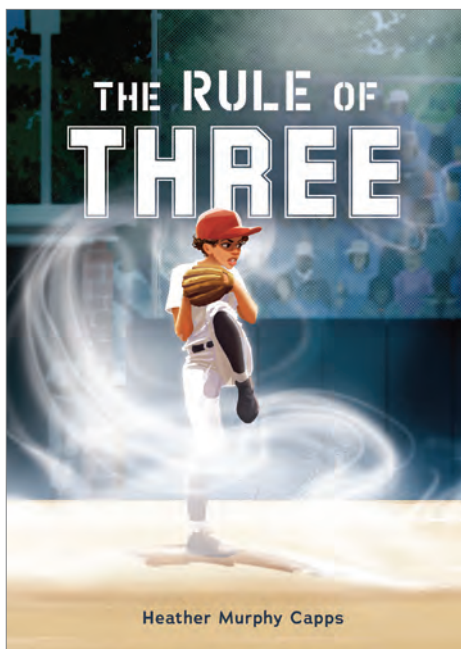
I send them a note about the Salt House. Maybe we can team up and fight for the sharks together.

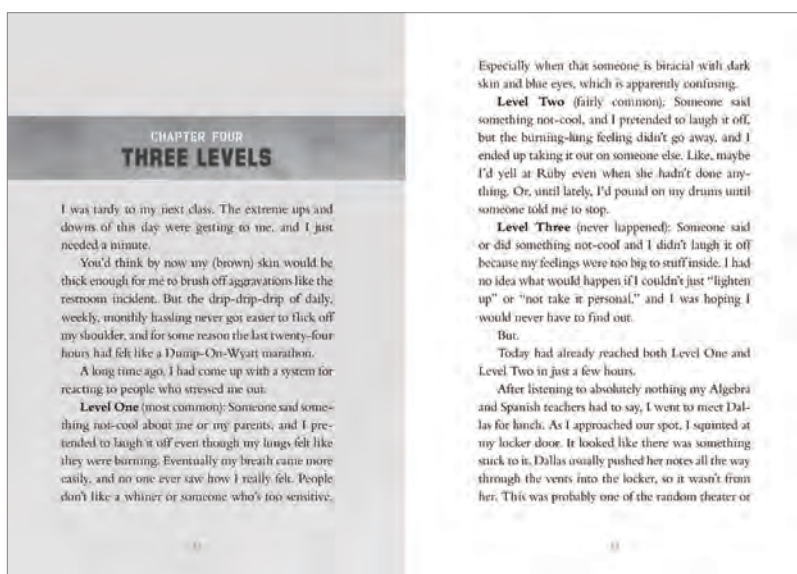

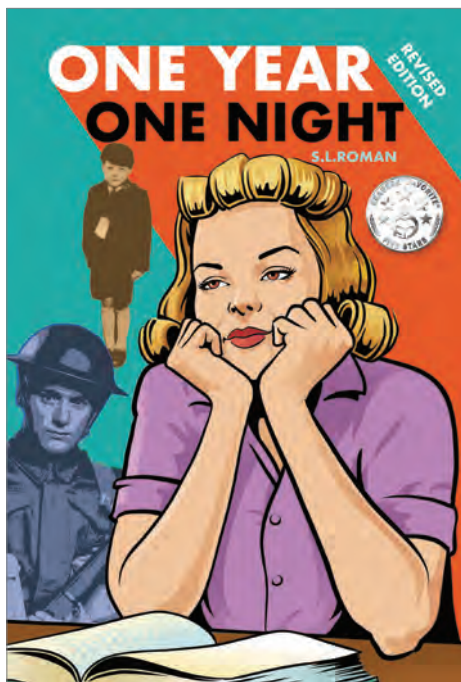

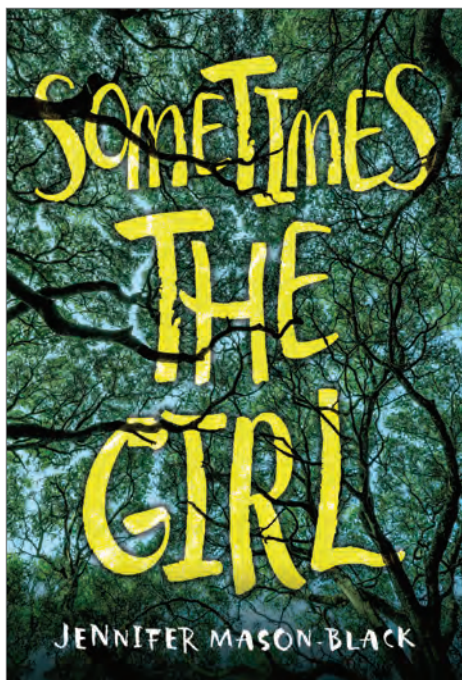

It's not until late in the afternoon that I find any evidence of her having written a book. The last box I reach for doesn't have a handwritten label like everything else so far—*Lampshades or Candles or Minor Nests*.

Instead, there's a packing slip taped to the outside when I rotate it. I open it anyway, as required, to make sure that it really does contain twenty-four copies of *Tongues as of Fire*.

It's a strange title. In ninth-grade English, Mr. Cooper explained that it came from the Bible and had to do with Pentecost. Not that this cleared anything up. But the title didn't stop me. I read the whole book in two days, then started again, this time more slowly so I could savor the language. At least half the class skipped it completely, relying on the Wikipedia summary instead.

The copy I pick up is pristine. No creases, the dust jacket free of any signs of wear. I open it. The pages make that crackling sound of a new book springing to life.

Only this one isn't new. This one is almost fifty years older than I am. I turn to the first page.

The night the world burned, my mother woke me from sleep with the light of her lanterns and the touch of her fingers.

I can hear Elsie reading it. Not how she sounds now—the way she sounded on the old vinyl Mr. Cooper brought into class,

a scratchy recording of a reading she gave in the late '50s. Her voice was strong. No nonsense. At least that's how I remember it. I could probably find it on YouTube if I wanted.

Sticky fingers isn't my vice, but right at this moment, I want one of these books. The box is complete, all twenty-four copies. Even if I could stuff one down my shorts and carry it out, it would be obvious later that one's missing.

Why would she have done that—left the entire box untouched? I put the copy back, run a hand over the stack of spines. Then again, why did she stop writing after one book?

"Some people have just one thing they want to say to the world," Mr. Cooper told us. "Maybe when you write something that good, that true, that captures something so essential, then you don't feel you need to write more."

It sounded reasonable at the time. I pick up the copy again, look at the back flap. The author photo, surprisingly, isn't a glossy posed one. Someone caught young Elsie with her head turned, her bob ruffled by wind. Something short of a smile rests on her lips. 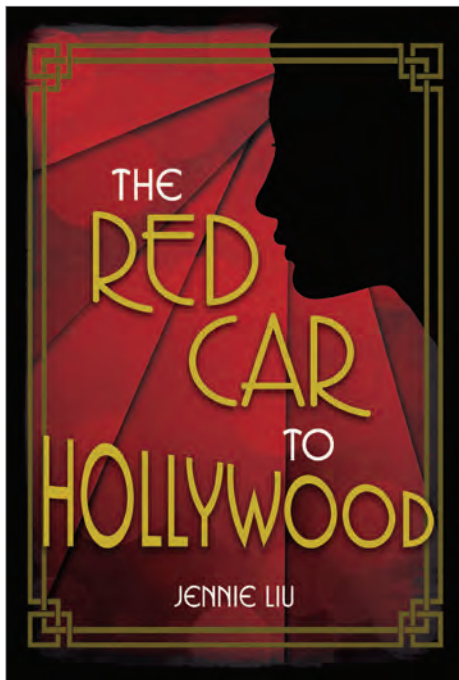

The funny thing was that Mrs. Kuen was the one who inadvertently connected Russell and me when she arranged my piano lessons with his sister Irene.

We had moved to Los Angeles from San Francisco in late-February, when Ba took a partnership with Mr. Lew. A couple of weeks after we settled in, Mrs. Kuen visited Ma to invite us to the Chinese Methodist Church. Ma led her upstairs to our sitting room. Perched on our worn velvet sofa, Mrs. Kuen let her eyes wander over the altar table with the brass incense burner, the red scrolls that recorded our ancestors' names, Ba's rocking chair with the padded leather seat, and Ma's embroidery loom resting on a worktable. It was more than a little proud of our mix of secondhand American furniture and marred Chinese pieces from the shop, proud that Ba had been successful enough to move us beyond a single crowded room.

When Mrs. Kuen spotted our small piano and asked who played, Ma told her that I was self-taught. Mrs. Kuen asked me to play for her, so I sat down and pounded out "Everyone Loves My Baby," or at least my best rendition of it. I'd heard the song often back in San Francisco at my friend Mary's place. Her family owned a big shirt factory and had a Radiola.

Mrs. Kuen's mouth twitched. I couldn't tell what displeased

her more: the loud, jazzy tune, or the dropped notes from the broken or out-of-tune keys. She mentioned that the church was saving up for a piano and suggested that I learn to read music so I could play at services. She had associations with another church, First Methodist, and knew of a girl from that congregation who gave lessons.

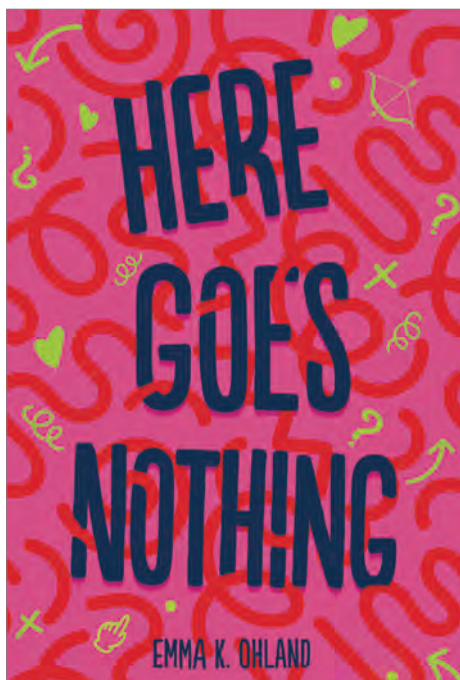
Although the prospect of playing hymns in church didn't particularly excite me, I agreed, hoping at least I could make some friends that way. Our move to Los Angeles had been a big letdown. Chinatown in San Francisco had been like its own city. We'd rarely needed to venture beyond the eight or ten square blocks of the district, where we had our own churches, schools, theaters, stores of all kinds. I had friends I'd grown up with, gone to school with all my life. My friends and I, boys included, had sometimes slipped out in the evenings and gathered at the corner near the lamppost to gab—at least until the disapproving frowns of elders drove us home.

But here in Los Angeles, the Chinatown quarter was much smaller. Many of the buildings were rickety and crumbling, with only one or two stories. The side streets were still unpaved, fading out to the barren pebbly lots of a railyard and a gas plant. Beyond those were the dirt roads and garden plots of the vegetable sellers who rickled by in the early mornings with their horses and carts. It was as if the had brought us to some remote outpost.

There were far fewer kids my age here, so we didn't even have our own high school. I'd ended up at Polytech, a mostly white school, unlike my old school where everyone was Chinese. I'd only seen a couple of other Chinese students on campus, plus a few Japanese, Korean, and Mexican kids. No one was friendly. I moved around the halls feeling invisible. Only after I'd been enrolled a couple of weeks had we found out that most of the Chinatown kids went to Lincoln High.

Thomas presents *The Hate U Give* at the Massachusetts Conference for Women in Boston, Massachusetts, in 2019.

Thomas was determined that this book would make it into the world. She had been sending her other work to literary agents. A literary agent can help an author land a book deal by sending the work to publishers. By 2015, literary agents had already rejected her other children's book manuscript sixty times.

Thomas's hard work and perseverance finally paid off when she contacted We Need Diverse Books, a nonprofit created to promote diversity in children's books. Thomas submitted her work to one of their inaugural contests and won a cash prize. With the money from the award, she

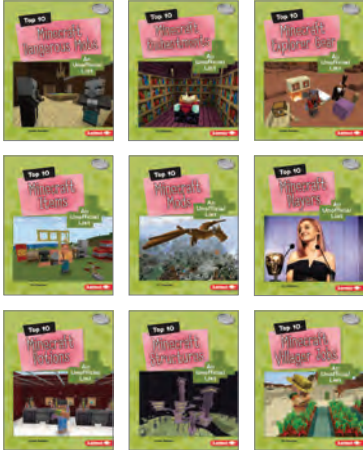
was able to get a new laptop, but more important, a panel of judges told her that her novel was good. The title of her book *The Hate U Give* comes from Tupac Shakur, whose group Thug Life had an album that shared the group's name. The Thug part of the name stood for "the hate u give."

On February 28, 2017, Balzer + Bray, part of publisher HarperCollins, finally published *The Hate U Give*. The book achieved immediate success, debuting at number one on the *New York Times* bestseller list. It also won the ALA's William C. Morris YA Debut Award, a Boston Globe-Horn Book Award, the UK Waterstones Children's Book Prize, and the German Youth Literature Award.

TUPAC'S "DEAR MAMA"

In 1995 Tupac Shakur released his hit song "Dear Mama," dedicated to his mother, Afeni Shakur. She had been a member of the Black Panther Party. Tupac was raised by his mother, and they endured some tough times when he was a child. Despite their hardships, he praised his mother as being a Black queen who did all she could to provide for them. The song went on to achieve triple platinum, one of the highest honors for a song. Many rap critics call it one of the top ten songs of all time.
