





In 2019 Sophie Cunningham was made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for her contributions to literature. **Anil Tortop** was born and raised in Türkiye. She moved to Australia in 2011, and has been trying to get used to the local eight-legged house intruders and slithering visitors to her garden ever since. Originally an animator, she shifted her focus to children's books and works primarily digitally. Her previous books include *Tippy and Jellybean* and *Flipper and Finnegan* by Sophie Cunningham, *Bat vs Poss* by Alexa Moses, and *Pigasus* by Zanni Louise. Anil lives in Queensland with her husband and daughters.








THE ENCHANTMENT OF GOLDEN EAGLE



Today, I am this and tomorrow I'm that.


Today, I'm a tiger! Tomorrow, a cat.







Sean McCann, illustrated by Jade Goodwin



A joyful story celebrating the natural world, the sharing of culture through Noongar language and the awe that comes from seeing, hearing and feeling how elemental forces shape the earth.

Papa says we're going to a special place today.

'If we djinang (look), ni (listen), goordoo (feel), we might hear boodjar wangkiny (earth speak). We might even feel her heartbeat.'

I wonder what that will sound like? Will the earth's heart beat just like ours?

A bush walk in a stunning landscape becomes a heartfelt invitation for children to engage with their senses, care for the environment, and learn some Noongar language words along the way.

Sean McCann is from Gadigal Country, NSW, but grew up on Dharawal land in southwest Sydney. In the early 1900s, his grandmother was placed into a mission on Gadigal land. Where she was taken from, and information about her parents, remains unknown. Sean currently lives on Noongar land in Perth with his wife and two young daughters. He is a small business owner, a rope access technician and a rigger working in remote areas of WA. *Earthspeak* is his first book. **Jade Goodwin** is an illustrator and Gamilaroi woman. She is committed to showcasing






a range of perspectives through her illustrations, with the aim of inspiring children and adults alike. She has illustrated numerous books including Ash Barty's Little Ash series and My Dream for You.



THE LAST EGG

Sofie Laguna, illustrated by Jess Racklyeft



Sofie Laguna's many books for young people have been published widely internationally. She has been shortlisted for the Queensland Premier's Awards, and twice awarded Honour Book by the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA).

When Mother Bird and Father Bird discover a large blue egg in their nest, they treat it as their own. A beautiful story about love and kindness and loyalty in the face of adversity, from the awardwinning creators of many much-loved picture books including *Iceberg* and *When You're Older*.

Mother Bird sat over her eggs.

'Not long now,' she said to Father Bird.

Father Bird brought her worms and seeds.
'Not long at all.'

When an extra egg appears in their nest and takes too long to hatch, Mother Bird and Father Bird must risk their lives to keep it warm.

And as the freezing winter takes hold and it seems all hope is lost, only something miraculous will save them.

She is also a highly acclaimed author for adults. Sofie lives in Melbourne with her husband and two sons. **Jess Racklyeft** creates a variety of illustrated things – picture books, paintings, prints, pins and cards – mainly in watercolours. Her art often combines collage experimentation and lots of watercolour. Sometimes she writes the books as well. Jess has won several illustration accolades including CBCA Picture Book of the Year for *Iceberg* (written by Claire Saxby). 






MY COUSINS, MY WORLD

Colourful palettes, graphic shapes and cheery characters are features of her work, and she illustrates them all from her home studio

in Melbourne. Her picture books include Stay for Dinner, Ammi's Sari and The Boy Who Tried to Shrink his Name, all written by Sandhya Parappukkaran. She won the CBCA New Illustrator award in 2022.

My mum is a Super Mum, the best I've ever known. She loves her trackies and her Uggs, her coffee, and her phone.


She comes to my concerts, and pins up my art, She helps me be brave and follow my heart.



How do you fix a wobbly tractor wheel?


Goat and pig and horse and friends have some ideas!

Carla Martell worked in the animation industry until illustrating her first children's book in 2020, Tulip & Doug by Emma Wood, and is currently working on her eleventh book. Her recent collaboration with author Juliette MacIver, Duck Goes Meow, won Best Picture Book in the 2023 New Zealand **Book Awards for** Children and YA.





This hilarious picture book will have readers in stitches ... (especially if you take it too literally!)



Dogs with jobs? What more could you want! A delightful exploration of the many careers of our canine companions.


Dogs may be man's best friend, but sometimes that's just their side hustle!



Claire Saxby, illustrated by Jess Racklyeft




Explore the fascinating world of an underwater volcano with award-winning picture book creators Claire Saxby and Jess Racklyeft.



Claire Saxby's work has won several awards including CBCA Honour Book, a NSW Premier's Literary Award, a SCBWI Crystal Kite Award, an Environment Award for Children's Literature, an Educational Publishing Award and the Whitley Award multiple times. CAUTION! THIS BOOK CONTAINS DEADLY REPTILES

Corey Tutt, illustrated by Ben Williams



This is the ultimate reptile book for kids by DeadlyScience founder Corey Tutt, bestselling author of *The First Scientists*. Bursting with vibrant illustrations and cool facts about more than 60 reptiles, Corey Tutt celebrates First Nations knowledge about animals found on Country, from lizards and snakes to turtles and crocodiles.

Sharing knowledge from 20 different First Nations, this is a reptile book unlike any you've seen before. For each reptile featured, you'll discover its name in a First Language, plus learn about favourite feeds, where it likes to live, breeding and babies, conservation, predators and prey, and most importantly, what makes that reptile deadly (in a good way)!

The amazing facts in this book will astound you! Did you know that a central bearded dragon's beard can change colour to protect it from predators? Or that the temperature of a turtle egg nest determines if the baby turtles will be boys or girls? Or that some First Nations names for reptiles can be more scientifically accurate than the European names, such as the common death adder that is more closely related to a brown snake than an adder?

Corey Tutt is a Kamilaroi man who was born on Yuin Country. As a kid, he dreamed of becoming a zookeeper and in high school he developed a love of STEM subjects. But unlike the arts and sport, he found there was little encouragement for Aboriginal people to pursue careers in STEM. In 2018 Corey founded DeadlyScience, a not-for-profit organisation that aims to provide science resources to remote schools in Australia. In 2020, Corey was named the NSW Young Australian of the Year, and a Human Rights Hero by the Australian Human




Rights Commission. In 2022, Corey received an OAM for service to Indigenous STEM education. He is an Associate Professor at Western Sydney University.

Ben Williams (Jangala/Jaburrula) is a young Aboriginal artist from the Kanturrpa clan, totem Milway, of Warlmanpa Country. Ben creates contemporary art that is inspired by his family (who are also artists!), his spiritual connection to the land and animals, and his life journey as a queer Blak person.

Featuring journal entries, poetry, quotations, drawings, paintings and photographs, Alison Lester and Coral Tulloch have selected an inspiring mix of their own and others' work, from the early age of exploration through to the present day.

Alison Lester's books are favourites around the world. In 2012, Alison became Australia's first Children's Book Laureate, a position she shared with Boori Monty Pryor. In 2016, she was awarded the Dromkeen Medal for her outstanding achievement in Australian children's literature, and in 2018 she became the first children's book creator to win the Melbourne Prize for Literature for her contribution to Australian literature and cultural and intellectual life. In 2019, Alison was awarded an Australia Post Legends Award and featured on a stamp, and received a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in the Australia Day Honours List. www.alisonlester.com.

Coral Tulloch has illustrated over sixty fiction and non-fiction books for children. Her book Antarctica: The Heart of the World, which she wrote and illustrated, won the 2004 Environment Award for Children's Literature. One Small Island, Coral's highly-acclaimed book about Macquarie Island which she created with Alison Lester, won the 2012 CBCA Book of the Year Award, as well as the Environment Award for Children's Literature in the same year.
