

BORED! BY FELICITA SALA

A very bored girl is struck by inspiration in this clever story from much-loved creator Felicita Sala.

Rita is bored. She's tried stretching her body across her bedroom, side-eyeing herself in the mirror, stomping her feet and swinging her arms. Her mind drifts to a daydream. What if the bored people in the world gathered together and got onto a bus? What if the boredom filled them up like balloons? What if they floated into the sky, bobbing along? By the time Rita's mother calls her for dinner, she's very busy.

Anyone who's ever been really bored will find catharsis in Rita's plight. As all creative people eventually learn, boredom can be a launchpad to great ideas. Sala's expressive, inviting illustrations and sly storytelling are a guaranteed antidote to the doldrums.

FELICITA SALA is the author and illustrator of *If You Run Out of Words, What's Cooking at 10 Garden Street?, What's Cooking in Flowerville?,* and *Lunch at 10 Pomegranate Street,* which has been translated into ten languages. She is the illustrator of the Society of Illustrators Gold Medal book *As Night Falls* and the *New York Times/*New York Public Library Best Illustrated Children's Book *She Made a Monster.* She is also a recipient of the Premio Andersen (the Andersen Prize).

Grownups say they're harmless, but kids know the truth: vegetables are dangerous!


Deep in the dark of the refrigerator, they make their devious plans. Spinach will try to smother you. The radishes are ready to rumble. The kale is clutching cutlery.

Take a bite out of this giggle-worthy picture book with whimsical illustrations, perfect for picky eaters and veggie fans alike.





JUST ONE OWL



THANK YOU, SCHOOL



BY ERIC VELASQUEZ


How does a bear go to the ballet? A polar bear escapes the zoo and ventures through the city in this heartfelt wordless picture book from award-winning Afro-Latino artist Eric Velasquez.

When dancers have a photoshoot at the zoo, a young ballerina and a polar bear form a special friendship. When his new friend leaves her scarf behind, the polar bear must venture into the city to return it before her performance. However, the theatergoers eye the strange bear with suspicion. When the ushers won't let him inside, the ballerina comes to his rescue and welcomes him in. The polar bear has dreamed of seeing the ballet, and now he gets to be a part of it in the most surprising way.

A wordless story of unlikely friendship that celebrates art and its ability to connect us, this picture book also opens a conversation about alienation and empathy. Who is kept out of the theater? How can we welcome them in? Eric Velasquez brings a dream-like magic to this tale of empathy and kindred spirits.

ERIC VELASQUEZ's awards include the Coretta Scott King Award for new talent, a Pura Belpré Award, an NAACP Image Award, and a Carter G. Woodson Award. For Holiday House, he both wrote and illustrated Looking for Bongo, and illustrated Ol' Clip-Clop: A Ghost Story by Patricia C. McKissack and New Shoes by Susan Lynn Meyer.

Since birth, Willa has had a shadow that stays beside her, always just out of reach. Until Mom and Willa visit a replica of an ancient Cherokee village. It's here, among daub houses and brown hands crafting, that Willa realizes that Spirit is her ancestors, beckoning her to claim her Cherokee heritage. Debut illustrator Mary Lupton lovingly includes nods to Cherokee beadwork and weaving. The book ends with a moving conclusion for children to embrace their own ancestors.

Debut author-illustrator Nancy So Miller retells this centuries-old Korean tale on the origin of the sun, moon, and stars with her diorama art. Fresh additions to the story include themes of sisterhood, Korean astronomy, and a sweet bedtime ending.

I AM A BON DANCER






FIELD TRIP TO DINOSAUR VALLEY




LITTLE REBELS

HOW TO GROW A FAMILY TREE




A barnyard mystery takes on a noir-esque spin in this hilarious picture book perfect for fans of 7 Ate 9 and Interrupting Chicken.




The cow says "moo," the horse says "neigh," the sheep says "baa," and the goat also says "baa?" Now what? No one wants to share their sound!


Threaded with a sneaky message about sharing, Zip Zap Wickety Wack will inspire new nonsense and new values.
