If the campers learn to change their self-destructive ways, they'll come out the other side as better versions of themselves. Devin is determined to escape. She's also determined to ignore Sheridan, the cruel-mouthed bully. But there's something strange about these woods—inhuman faces appearing between the trees, people who shouldn't be there flashing in the leaves—and when the campers wake up to find both counselors missing, therapy becomes the least of their problems. But what lies in the woods may not be as dangerous as what the campers are hiding from each other—and if the monsters have their way, no one will leave the woods alive.




