



Sometimes finding the funny can make everything feel just a little more sunny. And some days can feel just about perfect, regardless of what happens.



BEATRICE AND THE NIGHTINGALE

In 1924, a BBC audience of more than one million listeners across the world listened in amazement to the first live radio broadcast of a nightingale accompanying the famed young cellist Beatrice Harrison.

Beatrice Harrison was considered one of the greatest cellists of the 20th century, a musical prodigy, from a most unusual family—all girls and all accomplished musicians. This biography describes Beatrice's perseverance and singular dedication to music from a very early age, lovingly bolstered by her parents and sisters. The Harrison family paved the way for a generation of female musicians.

One evening when Beatrice had come out to her garden to play the cello, she heard a creature repeating the music she was playing. It turned out to be a nightingale. She played many nights with the bird and was completely enthralled. Wanting to share the experience, she convinced the head of the newly formed BBC to take a chance on a live broadcast from her garden. The resulting duet was a smashing success and for twelve years thereafter the cellist and the bird were broadcast annually to BBC listeners from her garden in Surrey.

BEATRIX AND HER FRIENDS

A Beatrix Potter biography that brings to life the creatures of the natural world she loved and the many endearing animal characters she created - out in time for the 160th anniversary of her birth.

Beatrix Potter remains one of the most beloved creators of children's books, beginning with The Tale of Peter Rabbit in 1902 and continuing through 23 more Little Tale titles. Potter's stories featured a world of unforgettable animal characters that have entertained youngsters for generations. But Potter was more than a children's author—she was also an accomplished artist, a forward-looking farmer, and a committed preservationist. In her later years, she helped save over 4,000 acres of farms and wooded areas in the Lake District region of England.

Born in 1866, Beatrix grew up in a big house in London. Her Victorian parents rarely interacted with Beatrix and hesitated to let her associate with other children fearing illness. She relished family vacations in the countryside, where she could roam freely in the nearby fields and forests and observe the wonders of nature. Back home, Beatrix and her younger brother invented their own entertainment. Over the years, they brought all kinds of animals into their nursery. Beatrix, who loved to draw, spent hours every day sketching each creature, especially the mice and rabbits. A favorite was the rabbit she named Peter Piper.



ERNŐ RUBIK AND HIS MAGIC CUBE




In 2023, the world record for solving the Rubik's Cube was broken by Max Park, who finished in 3.13 seconds! And then there's you. Did you ever get so frustrated with a Rubik's Cube that you wanted to pull it apart and put it back together in order? Were you to do so, you'd see how cleverly one of the world's most popular toys is assembled. Working together, the 26 pieces combine to make 43 quintillion possible configurations—but only one solution. A solitary child, Erno Rubik grew up in post-World War II Hungary obsessed with puzzles, art, nature, and the underlying patterns and structures. He became a professor of art, architecture, and design, who was still fascinated with how objects work together, sometimes becoming greater than their components. In a quest to help his students understand three-dimensional objects and how they move not to mention a desire to entertain himself—he fashioned a cube whose pieces twisted and turned without breaking, and unexpectedly invented the Rubik's Cube, the most popular puzzle in history.


The unbelievable true story of the American soldiers who used inflatable tanks and fake radio broadcasts as weapons in World War II.

Right around D-Day of World War II, a small, unarmed American army unit deployed to Nazi-occupied France. Instead of artillery, this unit fought with stagecraft, artistry, and deception. Their "weapons" included inflatable rubber tanks and giant speakers broadcasting fake military maneuvers. The soldiers called themselves the Ghost Army. Many of them had creative backgrounds in fashion, theater, and music, and they used their talents to trick and confuse the enemy. Often, their mission was to draw enemy fire away from other soldiers and toward themselves.

Rebecca Siegel uses original research, declassified records and photos, and a boots on the ground narrative style to tell the incredible experiences of these heroic soldiers.

Most upper-elementary students are familiar with mutually beneficial partnerships in nature—butterflies and milkweed, for example, or clownfish and anemones. But award-winning science poetry author Leslie Bulion has delved into recent research on mutualism and found fresh examples of these relationships for young readers to investigate, including the egg-laying carrion beetle and its hitchhiking mite passengers, as well as the little goby fish that guards the pistol shrimp from predators in exchange for a safe haven.

Reading aloud these clever verses for two voices will help young learners engage with and enjoy these marvels of nature, and notes in the back of the book shed more light on the diversity of poetic forms.
