

But the Ironfell line of succession isn't clear-cut, as their lineage is one of bloodshed. In order to inherit the Puppeteer's vast wealth - and the rare and terrifying supernatural power that makes them the most powerful and feared family in the land - the Ironfells must battle to the death. At the end of the Inheritance, one of them will emerge as the new Puppeteer - and the harbinger will be restored.

Walter, the gentle grandson of the Puppeteer, has spent most of his childhood planning what he will do when the Inheritance begins. Unlike the others, he has no interest in being the chosen heir - he hopes only to survive.

But the Inheritance is complicated by the arrival of a newcomer. By the time the harbinger falls, it's clear that greater political machinations are at work - and that the emergence of a new Puppeteer will have ramifications far beyond the Ironfell walls.





STREANSHALT

A slow burn literary horror rooted in selkie mythology, Streanshalt is for readers of Julia Armfield, Lucy Rose, and Andrew Michael Hurley.

1886. A young girl's body is found on the shores of Streanshalt, a town teetering on the edge of the north east coast. In devastation and fury, the girl's mother curses the perpetrator and the entire town that raised him, damning their past, present, and future. As her son, Alfie, watches on helplessly, she walks into the sea with her daughter's body to drown, sealing her curse.

1906. Three mysterious women wash up on the shore with no memories of themselves, and no belongings other than three small locked trunks. Each woman is found and sheltered by a different citizen of Streanshalt who sees their discovery as an answer to their problems. Alfie, desperate to crack through the loneliness that has marked his life since his family's death, sees a companion. Ester, mistress to a wealthy Earl and in need of a baby to trap her lover, sees a fertile vessel. And Mrs Mulgrave, head of the local ballet school and high end brothel - sees a new star in the making. As the women open their trunks one by one, disaster befalls Streanshalt and the curse comes full circle, culminating in a shocking, devastating twist that will have readers flipping back to the novel's start.

Jessie Elland is an actress and author from the North East of England. An avid bookworm from the moment she could read, Jessie spent most of her childhood dreaming of writing books and scribbling down half-finished stories. THE LADIE UPSTAIRS was her debut novel.


IN CASE I GO MISSING
