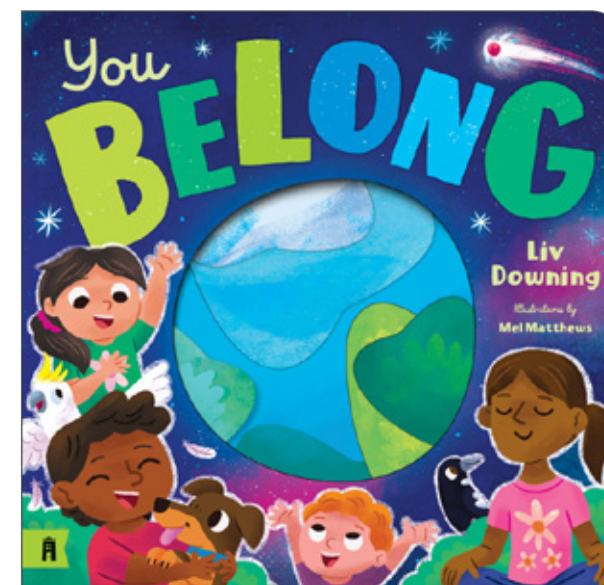

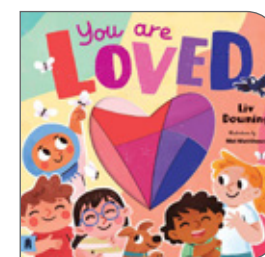

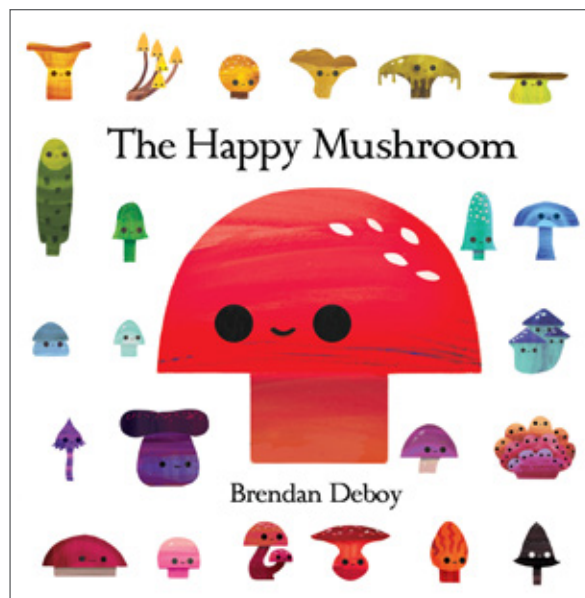

Not her soft little rug.

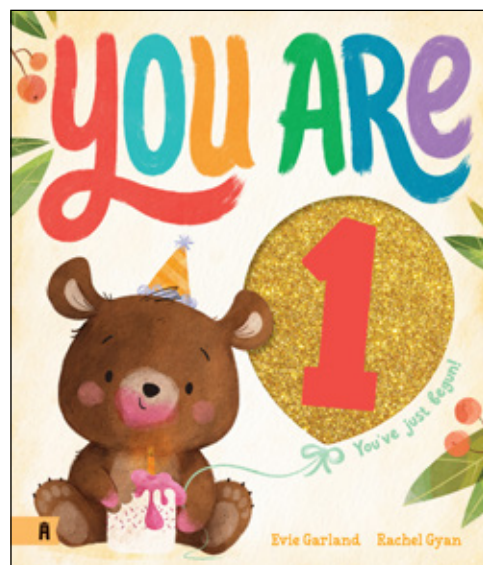
She just wants ... your hug.

Until there is one HUGE thunderstorm and they rush back home.

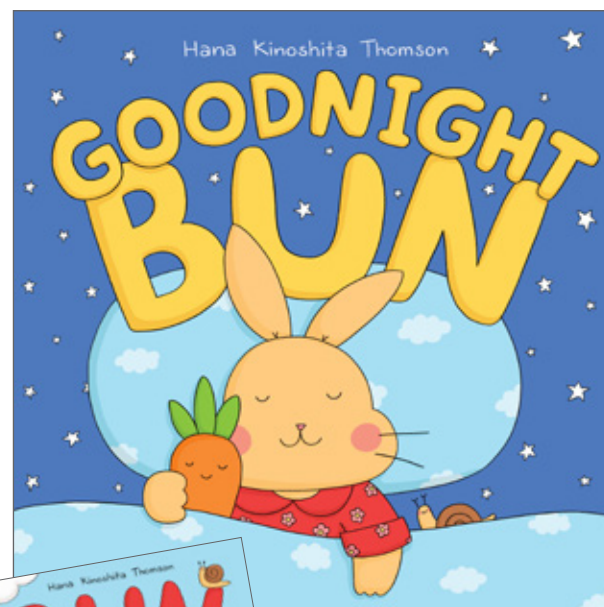
This child-centric story is loaded with learning opportunities and offers a sweet, loving and gently humorous reflection on the relationship between a child, her mother and the world around them.

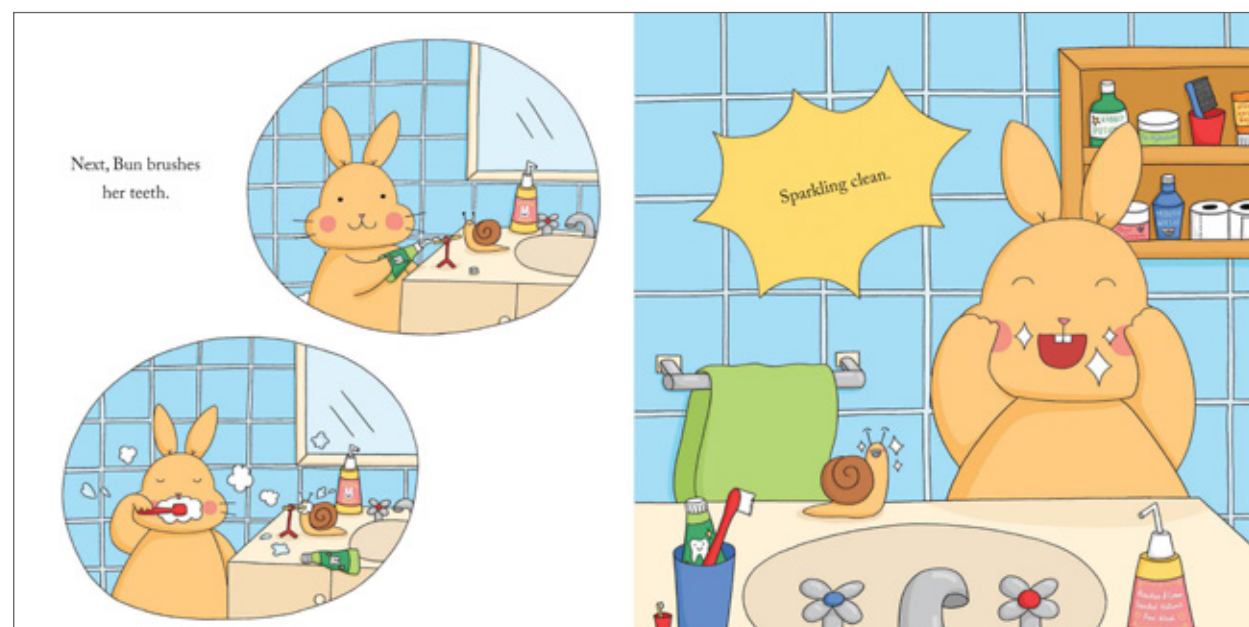

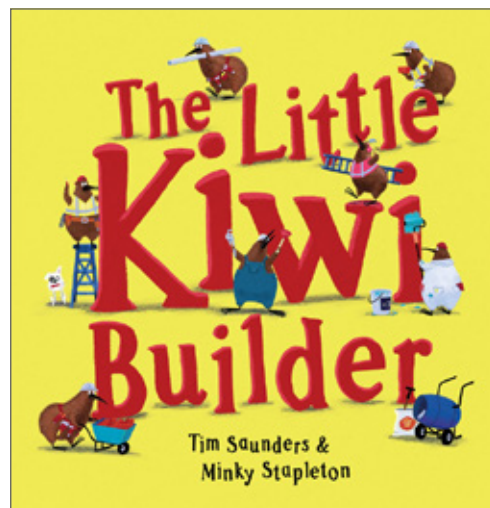

Until, that night ... uh-oh!

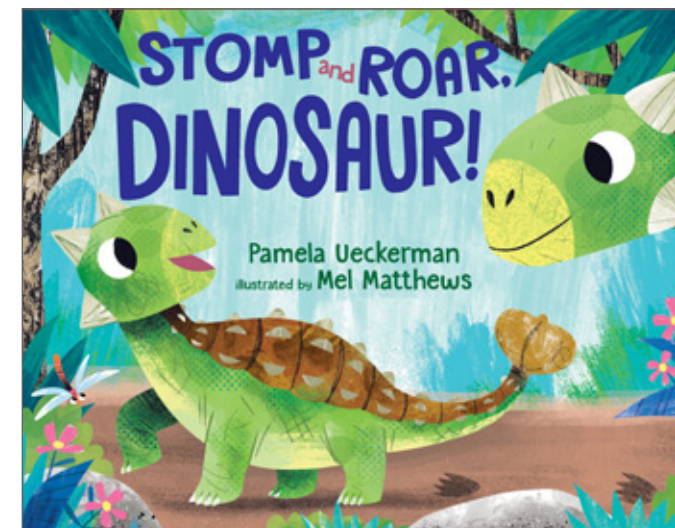

Yawn and snore, Dinosaur!

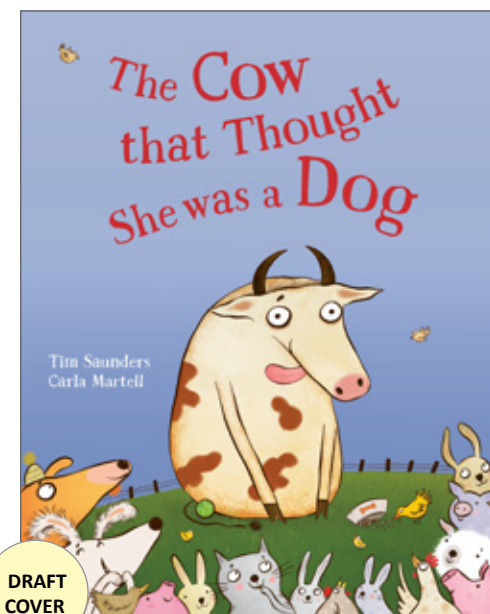

His 2011 title, *A Bus Called Heaven*, is endorsed by Amnesty International UK and was the winner of the 2012 Children's Book Council of Australia Picture Book of the Year Award – a prize Bob has won an unprecedented six times. In 2014, *Silver Buttons* was awarded the prestigious Prime Minister's Literary Award. Bob lives in Melbourne.

This joyful lyrical story vividly evokes a blind child's experience of a day at the beach – the baking heat, the sticky sand, the hum of the ocean, the smell of hot chips, the splash of the waves.

*I can't see summer, but it's clear in my mind.
I hear it, I feel it, in my heart all the time.*

Our edition of *All the Way I See* includes innovative accessibility features for blind, low-vision, D/deaf or hard of hearing audiences such as easy-to turn pages, a round corner for book orientation, and links to audio and sign language interpreted readings. It's also perfect for readers looking for stories about mindfulness, living in the moment, and the experience of living with disability.

Nas Campanella is the National Disability Affairs Reporter for ABC News and has worked as a reporter and presenter for more than a decade. She is passionate about supporting people with disabilities to tell their own stories. **Eliza Hull** is a musical artist, writer, journalist and disability advocate. She has edited a collection of essays about parenting with a disability called *We've Got This* and co-authored the picture book *Come Over To My House* with Sally Rippin and Daniel Gray-Barnett. **Sophie Beer's** books including *Love Makes a Family* have sold into many languages and close to one million copies. In 2016, Sophie underwent surgery for an acoustic neuroma, a brain tumour that affects balance, the facial nerve and hearing, and she is subsequently hard of hearing. *Thunderhead*, her first novel, was inspired by this transformative event.

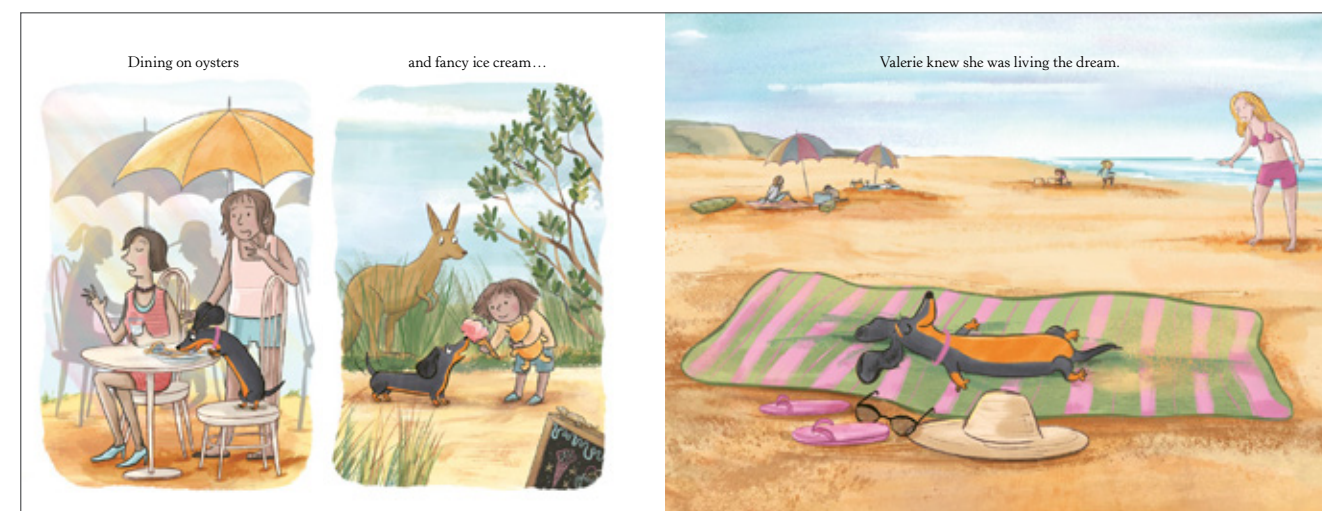
The bold and true(ish) adventures of Australia's Bravest Sausage Dog!

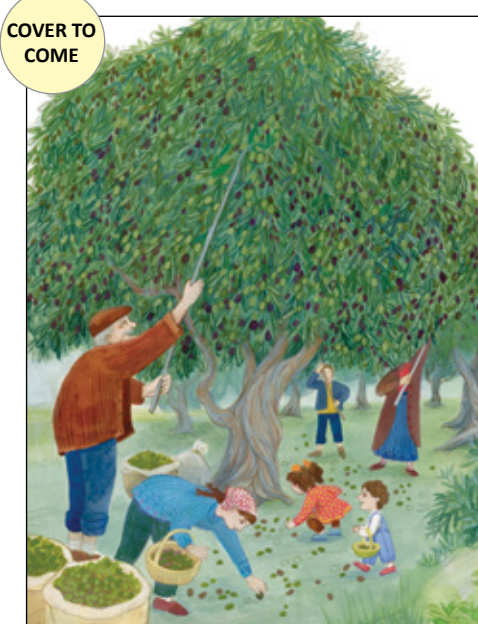

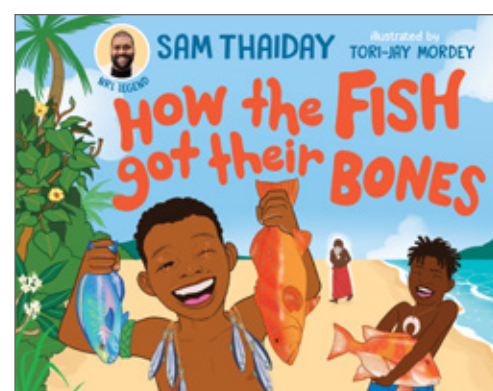

Children and Young Adults, and Best Children's Book at the 2023 PANZ Book Design Awards. His comics work has been published widely both locally and internationally.

Everything has to be just right, and things have a way of going wrong when Sylvia is around. Fortunately she is far away at summer holiday camp ... or is she?

All sorts of disasters happen in the lead up to the party – the doorman loses his pants, the famous Boubles biscuits are burnt – and a human fly has taken up residence in the Deluxe Suite! Mr Badger must use all of his charm and ingenuity to solve the mystery and put things right.

Leigh Hobbs is a star in Australian children's publishing. His subversive humour has delighted children for almost three decades and he has won every major Australian children's choice award. Leigh was the 2019 Australian Children's



Laureate and was one of five Australian Legends of Children's Literature featured by Australia Post on a stamp. His best-known children's books feature Old Tom, Horrible Harriet, Mr Badger, Mr Chicken and more, many of which have been adapted for screen or stage.

After the sun sets, the night creeps in and it's time for bed. But darkness shrinks as the full moon springs up above the trees, lighting the garden and inviting a child to take on an intrepid night-time adventure. A glorious celebration of imagination, courage and daring.

Sherryl Clark has published more than 40 books, from picture books to novels. Her novel *Farm Kid* won the 2005 NSW Premier's Literary Award, her verse novel, *Sixth Grade Style Queen (Not!)*, was a CBCA Honour Book in 2008, and many of her titles are Notable Books. *Mina and the Whole Wide World* won the 2022 Prime Minister's Award for Children's Literature. She writes both fiction and poetry, and works as a freelance editor.



Hannah Sommerville creates enchanting picture books using watercolour, gouache and digital illustrations. She has won multiple awards including CBCA 2022 Book of the Year – Early Childhood for *Jetty Jumping*, written by Andrea Rowe.

Will Angus succeed? Will Angus be OK? And what will happen between him and Lydia?

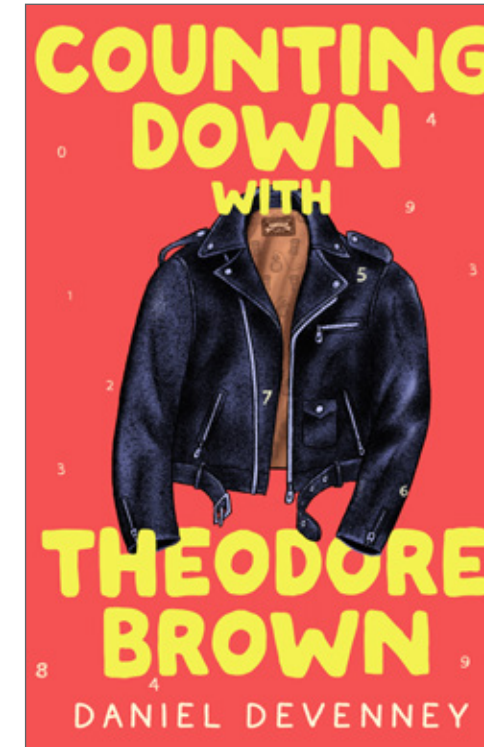
