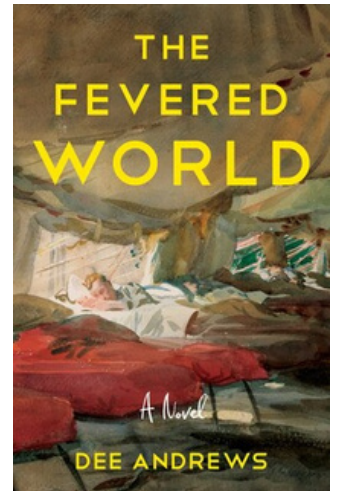
THE FEVERED WORLD
