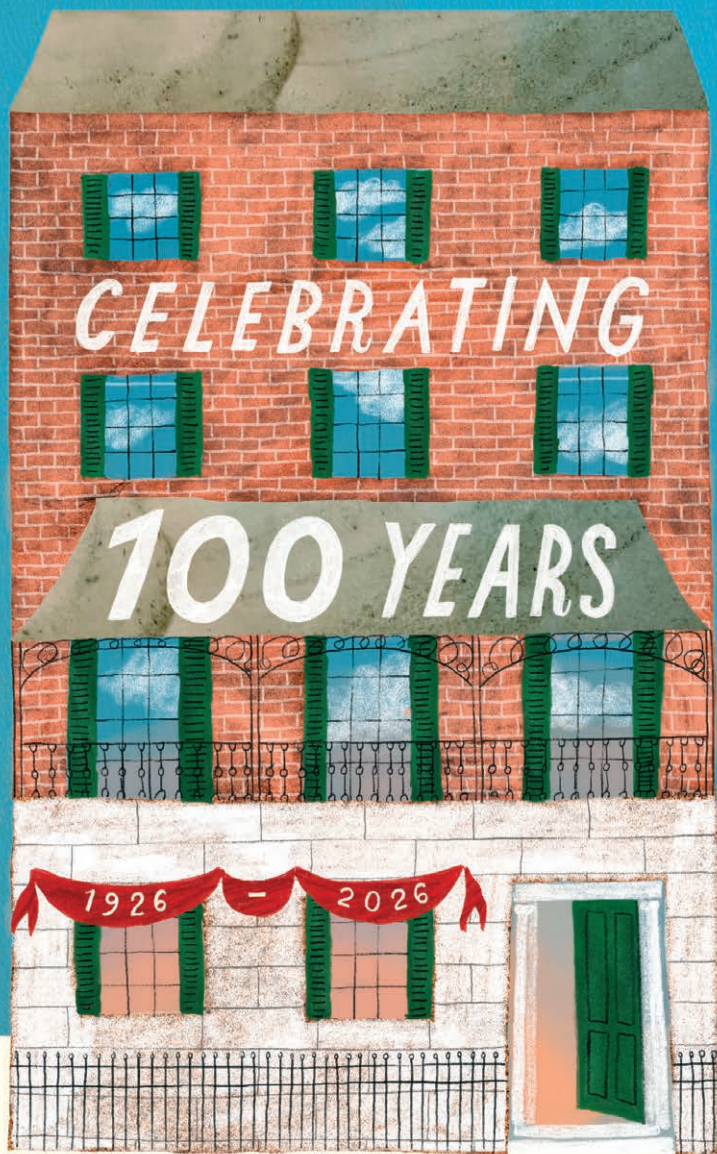

There's nothing like a road trip in a cramped carriage to make a witch fly off the handle.

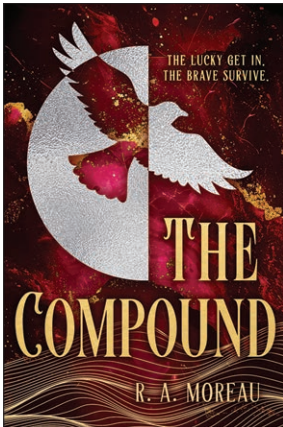
