But Riverside House is no quiet retreat. One wing is sealed off and collapsing. The Kaiser family is long gone, leaving the estate to Julian Hartsaw, a distant heir with little interest in helping her. And the deeper Camille digs into Kaiser's work, the more unsettling it becomes.

Drawn to Julian's frail, gifted nephew Victor and to Ethan Ramsey, whose family has served the estate for generations, Camille begins to uncover a tangled history when she finds a hidden message from her mother, warning her to stay away from Riverside House and the Hartsaws.

As Camille races to decode the truth buried in Kaiser's art, his descent into madness begins to mirror Victor's illness—and her own unraveling fear. With secrets closing in from all sides, Camille must decide who to trust... and whether the darkness surrounding Riverside House is only in her mind or something waiting in the river beyond the trees.

Teagan Quinn, the middle daughter to one of the wealthiest families in Hardsill, doesn't know what she wants. That is until she and her dragon Zella are shot out of the air by poachers and Zella is stolen from her. Then she's determined. She wants her dragon back and will do anything to do it.

Fin Barry, at the bottom of the metal-crafting food chain and in momentous debt, is an undercover ranger working to take down the poaching ring. When his team nets a silver dragon and the strangest girl he's ever met, he risks his undercover operation and saves her. But he can't save Zella.

After learning Fin is already infiltrating the poaching ring, Teagan offers a proposition. She'll cover his debts if he helps her also go undercover to get Zella back. Fin denies her at first, but when stubborn Teagan gets way over her head without him, Fin is forced to protect her with a lie, saying she's his girlfriend. So begins the ruse of fake-dating to maintain their undercover investigations.

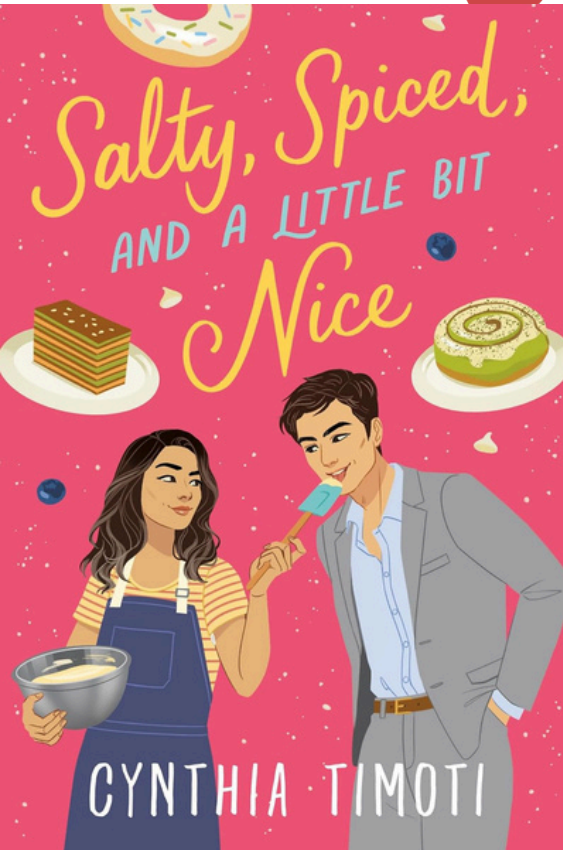

Nedda Lewers is a USA Today Bestselling Egyptian American author and former teacher. She writes books that take children on fun adventures and feature characters who are trying to make sense of the big, complicated world and their place in it. As a kid, Nedda lived in Queens, NY, where she spent many Sundays at the local library deciding how many books she could possibly carry on the fifteen-minute walk home. Every summer, she visited Cairo, where her parents are from, getting to know her big extended family. Even though it wasn't easy growing up with one foot in America and the other in Egypt, Nedda cherishes how that experience has given her a rich and expansive perspective from which she draws to write her stories. She has an MSEd from Bank Street and enjoyed a career of learning from her early childhood students. In 2017, she moved with her daughters and husband to Los Angeles and decided to focus on her writing. Her favorite place to craft stories is an old but loved striped chair in her living room with her dogs nestled at her side.

Eleven-year-old Hattie Ramzy investigates the theft of an Egyptian relic in this enthralling middle grade mystery for fans of *The Swifts*.

Hattie wants to escape. She's stuck in her grandmother Nenna's historic Luxor Mansion with pretentious, pompous Egyptologists. She can't live up to the name of her great family: her grandmother is iconic, her parents are renowned, and her sisters are spunky and sharp. But Hattie is just plain nervous.

So Hattie is hiding in the shadows when the eccentric Egyptologists reveal Nenna's eightieth birthday gift: the ancient bust of Nefertiti, on loan from a German museum. Nenna's dream of seeing the artifact on Egyptian soil is fulfilled. But soon, the bust goes missing. And Hattie is sure the thief is still inside Luxor House.
